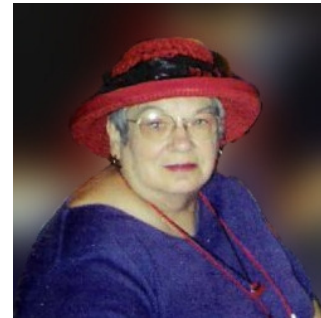


Beverly Gasper
