

Lewis Hunter, Oct. 5, 1956-June 29, 2017

NAUVOO, Ill. - Lewis William Hunter, 60, of Nauvoo, Ill., passed away Thursday, June 29, 2017, at the Valley Baptist Medical Center in Harlingen, Texas. At Fun N Sun he lived for a short time at Restful 180.

Lewis was born Oct. 5, 1956, in Evergreen Park, Ill., the son of Robert and Lois Jane Lewis Hunter. On Nov. 20, 1974, he was united in marriage to Pamela Joyce Lewis in Lemont, Ill. She survives.
