



Jane Walzer McPherson of Greece, NY, passed away on June 11th, 2017 after a brief illness with bladder cancer. She was predeceased by her parents, Edwin and LaMoine Walzer. Jane was the loving wife of Robert N. McPherson for 66 years, and wonderful mother to five children: Scott McPherson of Hamlin, NY, Donna (Wayne) Smith of Brockport, NY, Lori (Hugh Kroehling) McPherson of Merritt

Island, FL, Sheri (Dave) Rockafellow of Richmond, VA and Vicki (Steve) Shaw of Greece, NY. She was the grandmother to nine: Francine McPherson of Rochester, Courtney and Julie (Cameron Brocklehurst) Rockafellow of Richmond, VA, Kelli Kroehling of Columbus, OH, Bradley Kroehling of Merritt Island, FL, Rachael Smith of Brockport, and Kyle, Evan and Joseph Shaw of Greece.

Jane grew up in Rochester, attending #42 school, Charlotte HS, and the Rochester Business Institute. She met Robert at Charlotte HS, and they were married on Sept 1st, 1951. They moved into a small 14 ft trailer at the University of Connecticut where Robert pursued his Mechanical Engineering Degree and the Air Force R.O.T.C program. After graduation, they moved to West Mifflin, PA where their son Scott was

born. After a brief tour in Biloxi, MS, Robert served a year in Greenland, and they then settled in Greece, NY, where Robert started his career at the Eastman Kodak Company. Donna and the other girls soon followed.

Jane was a wonderful mother, transporting the five children to scouting, dance lessons, and numerous other activities. She was a talented seamstress, sewing many Halloween and dance costumes over the years. She enjoyed travel and camping - never missing a campfire opportunity. The family managed two six-week cross-country camping trips in 1967 and 1972 taking in most of the National Parks along the way.

When Robert retired in 1986 with 30 years of service from Eastman Kodak, the two enjoyed most of the next 30 years traveling to the Rio Grande Valley in TX where they enjoyed dancing, bridge, bowling, table tennis and golf. Jane spent much of her time researching her genealogy, and self-published a detailed book in 1998 recording the family tree back to John Jacob Walzer of Switzerland, immigrant ancestor (ca 1775).
