

Daniel Clyde Stineman

Dec. 21, 1940 - Feb. 18, 2015



Dan Stineman passed away unexpectedly at the Harlingen Medical Center, Harlingen, Texas, on Feb. 18, 2015. He was born to Clyde and Lois Stineman in Superior, Nebraska, on Dec. 21, 1940. In 1958 he graduated from Superior High School and in 1962 from Kearney Teachers College. Dan was married to Armona Banks in 1963. They were blessed with two children: a daughter, Susan, and a son, Jon.

Dan was the athletic director in Hartington, Nebraska (1963-66), and in Malvern, Iowa (1967-72). He coached high school football, basketball, and track at both places.

After teaching and coaching for 10 years, Dan made a career change. He graduated from the University of Nebraska College of Dentistry in 1977 and started a dental practice in Kimball, Nebraska. Retiring from private practice after 30 years, he continued working in his profession providing dental care to the service men and women at various Army posts in Kansas, Alabama, and Texas.

While spending the winter in the Rio Grande Valley of Texas, Dan and Armona made the decision to give up their full-time motorhome life for a permanent home in San Benito, Texas, in 2010. Dan found a part-time dental position providing care at Evans Juvenile Detention Center in Edinburg, Texas, where he was working at the time of his death.

Dan is survived by his wife Armona, daughter Susan, son Jon, and many family members in Nebraska and Texas. Shortly before he died Dan purchased a Radio Controlled car to use at the Zoomers Race Track at Fun N Sun. Sadly, he had little opportunity to pursue that hobby, but his granddaughter Alison, age 13, asked for his car and runs it in her driveway.
